1 Choose a Designated Learning Institution (DLI) – Apply and secure admission. 2 Receive a Letter of Acceptance (LOA) – Required for visa application. 3 Obtain a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) – New requirement effective 2024 − Issued by the provincial government to confirm student quota availability. 4 Prepare Financial Documents – Proof of tuition fees & living expenses. 5 Submit Study Visa Application − Online or through a Visa Application Centre (VAC). 6 Biometrics & Medical Exam − Required for processing. 7 Visa Approval & Travel to Canada − Once approved, prepare for your journey.

Processing Time: 4-12 weeks (may vary based on application volume).

Post-Study Work & PR Opportunities

- **Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)** Work in Canada for up to **3 years** after graduation.
- Express Entry & PR Pathway Gain points under Canadian Experience Class (CEC).
- **Provincial Nominee Programs (PNP)** Some provinces offer PR opportunities for graduates.
